A straight Q&A, this month, with...

Year of the Kite

1. You're all spread across Berkshire and Oxfordshire. How did you come together?

We estimate we have collectively known each other for 214 years. Being in a band together was bound to happen at some point. There are six of us. Some of us have had babies together. Others met in the bleak flatlands of East Anglia and played in bands together there. Other connections happened more locally but have their roots in gigs and obsessing about the detail of music.

2. Year of the Kite is an unusual name. Where did it come from and did you have a load of cast off ones?

It's from a misremembered Yo La Tengo song title, localised with respect to our scariest bird,

back from near-extinction. It came to Doug when riding his bike along Balmore Drive. The cast offs were so dreadful they have been lost in the mists of time. Once you have set the task of deciding on a band name it becomes utterly all-consuming and obsessive. You find yourself walking down the street scanning for references or ideas. This generally doesn't make for a great band name. Equally whilst combining two random words helps get you towards the top of a Google search list, it doesn't always make for anything decent.

3. You've done a couple of silent movie shows at South St. Where did that idea come from and can you tell us a bit more?

The idea to write and perform a live soundtrack has been in our minds for several years. Following the release of our debut album in 2018 we decided it was a good way to take a completely different approach to writing music. The writing process can be split amongst members of the band, in a way which doesn't really work if approaching conventional live shows. It allows members (such as drummer Matt 'Woody' Wood) to play different instruments, as the more conventional song components are not necessarily needed; drums can be left and larger soundscapes can be created.

The first time Matt saw the Krautrock legends Faust playing a soundtrack to Nosferatu he realised that it was something he would like to do one day. It is a classic silent Vampire film. Unlike Faust we (fortunately) don't run around naked and covered in dayglow paint, nor have access to cement mixers. We just write and improvise ideas which we then place with the film footage to see if it fits. There is a whole process of refining and re-working before it becomes the soundtrack to that scene.

Having played Nosferatu for Halloween 2018 we went on to approach the sci-fi epic Metropolis. We played that to another sold-out South Street audience in June. That allowed us take a different approach to Nosferatu, bringing in more electronics and keyboards.

4. What's the process of your writing and, typically, how long does it take you to put a song together?

Songs turn up in all different forms from all different directions; from fully formed songs to riffs or bits of lyrics. Some of them fall into place quickly, others develop over years. Some are written to a scene from a film, others brought in to fit. Having six members in a band means there is a regular stream of ideas and songs.

5. Do you have any superstitions or rules about how you form your songs?

No real superstitions apart from to fight the urge to add a tambourine. We do use the simile that certain songs are to be constructed like a cake. That seems to work.

6. Who's the most vocal in band and stamps their feet when they don't get their way?

We have no vocals in the new soundtrack material, so none of us I guess. Stamping feet? Sometimes needed in our rehearsal space – a 15th century church. It does get pretty cold.

Otherwise we all have our stropy moments.

7. Within the band, what are each member's main influences?

Our influences are pretty varied. Mostly cheese-based or savoury snacks from the local garage. Fear of death too. Doug claims he is heavily influenced by Stockhausen but doesn't really know what he's talking about. We went through a macaroon phase for a while.

8. What are the long term plans for the band and what have you got lined up?

Short term: more soundtrack adventures. Suggestions please!

Long term: Jazz Odyssey. Or a holiday. We also need to fund raise to repair the church where we rehearse.

9. Your style of music dictates you twiddle a few knobs and pedals, what would you do if you didn't have those to use?

We'd hit the instruments harder and scream.

10. And finally, who's the most organised?

Sorry, we have run out of time. ■

Colouring in...

Go into a pub in Reading lately, and you might notice a wooden box on the bar, with a load of badges pinned to the front, and wonder, "What the heck is that all about?" Well, guess what. We've got the answer.

The badges are produced by Muz, a man who now sees the world entirely in 32mm circles, and they are actually tiny 'micro-collages' made from images cut from hundreds of magazines, newspapers and flyers to create unique one-offs. That Led Zep one on the right, for instance, is made of six separate, painstakingly cut out, pieces of paper from one magazine article. See that Beach Boys one at the bottom... I've enlarged it here so you can see the work gone into cutting out that logo and matching it with its abstract background, taken from a tiny section of a different photograph.

I went round his house to have a look and was shown a massive collection of tiny images, potential backgrounds and, as yet uncut, magazines. It takes a lot of space: "You have to get all the bits out when you're looking for backgrounds". And a lot of patience: "If it's not right, and I can't manipulate it, it goes in the recycling."

The attention to detail is incredible. There's one Black Sabbath badge with an immaculately cut logo placed on a pattern from a postcard only available with the Polish release of the album the logo is taken from! Real die-hard fan stuff.

Apparently, Sound-check is already being mined for Muz's latest productions. An honour, indeed.

So, Paolozzi-esque collage in the form of the pop-cultural iconic object celebrated by Peter Blake? Or just a bloke making badges?

Who knows? Pretty cool, though. ■
