

It wasn't strictly his intention but, looking at them in 2025, with the Music Venue Trust reporting more venues closing every year and all that, it was a bit like Scrooge's third ghostie visit – the one with The Ghost of Rock 'n' Roll Yet to Come. Or something.

It's not all doom and gloom, here. Like everywhere, nobody's generating enough cash to actually *thrive* but there are enough people with the time, headspace and guts to mean there's loads out there to turn up and get involved with. You just need to know where and when.

WHITE 4BEL



It's pretty common for local bands to move on from these parts, chasing fame and fortune off in weird places like London or Brighton. Luckily for us, Toby and Joe tried it, didn't like it and came back home under new name White Label. But they obviously used their time away well, learning the ropes and sharpening their talents as they're back and they mean business.

It's been a fresh start in every way. Toby (frontman, vocals, guitar) and Joe (guitar) formed White Label last year and have been playing consistently since then. They just released their new EP 'Good For You', are about to release the next single and have a bag bursting with new ideas to work on after that.

For the EP release show in October, they took over a vintage clothes shop in Reading, Flamingos, which turned out to be a brilliant idea. Nestled in amongst the racks of coats and cosy jumpers, Toby's vocals floated in the air while Joe's guitar cut through to keep it all focussed and moving on. They wanted to do something more interesting that stood out, which they certainly did. And thanks to the lads for discovering a great new intimate venue for Reading. I hope the owners are up for opening their doors for more gigs.

We had a chat about their music and they say they've evolved out of the spirit of 2010s British rock and infused it with disco. "Streamlined" is a word they bring up a lot to describe the feel. The EP has a very minimalist, stripped back style that gives it a marvellous sound you can sink into. Previous single 'Stay Together' in particular lived rent free in my head for far longer than I expected and now it's gone I kinda miss it. But it comes back sometimes to visit.

That EP was written last year and recorded back in February. The new single 'Something About You' moves them on a step though. More disco, more guitar and a much heavier chorus than before, but still with plenty of dreamy, floaty vocals. This gradual evolution and refinement works really well for them and I'm looking forward to seeing what comes next.

It gets released on 21 st November with a headline show at The Butler on 29 th November. But there's more – another single in the new year and another EP in March. They've been writing loads of songs over the summer and it's all coming together nicely. And who knows, maybe there'll be an album before too long as well.

Toby explained that they met as teenagers at college, ACM in Guildford. Joe had a band doing bluesy/classic rock (after his dad took him to see AC/DC at seven years-old) and was looking for band members. Toby originally joined as guitarist but they couldn't find a singer that suited the sound, so Toby said he'd sing "for a bit, and then we'd find somebody better to do it". But that's when their writing partnership started and it's still going strong. Since then, they've been through a few different names and sounds until White Label. formed last year.



Creatively they work as a team. Joe says "Usually things start with a musical idea. The music is us two; the lyrics are ninety-nine per cent Toby." But Joe isn't shy to tell Toby what he thinks of a line if he doesn't like it.

Toby expands on that, "I like to wait until the song's got a vibe and structure and its mood.

So, we'll have a chord progression and drum beat and then once it's got its mood, then 'lll start thinking about what that inspires from me. Once it's got to a place that it's got a bit of an identity, then I'll think about what that inspires lyrically."ks too much lager in the pub... The guys we used to deal with working in bars."

Toby says the new sound is "way more modern, I'd say a bit more British as well really. But I think our musical influences have changed and maybe settled a bit as well. I think we're drawing from so many different places now. I think we're being influenced a lot more by music we grew up with. We're trying to make it modern and fresh."

That's where it starts but there's more to the story. "We both love a lot of hip-hop and disco. So those rhythmic influences definitely find their way in. It's there in the EP as well but definitely moving forwards there's those disco-y hip-hoppy rhythmic influences coming in. And then we're trying to build indie rock songs on top of that if you will. So, it's not rapping, I'm not a rapper!"

Not surprisingly he lists the Arctic Monkeys as an influence, but also say's he's a huge fan of D'Angelo which makes a lot of sense if you listen to the EP. And then they both say they're fans of the likes of Earth, Wind and Fire, Luther Vandross, Cool and the Gang and the Average White Band.

"We love all of that music. So, it's deep down, embedded in there. You wouldn't notice it, you wouldn't pull it out, but it's buried in there."

Toby says he watched this year's Nile Rogers and Chic Glastonbury performance online. "I was in awe watching them 'cos it's just such a show. The musicianship's incredible."

We move on to talking about the lyrics.

On the recent EP, Toby says "I think it sounds like I was going through something. I'm not sure if I knew I was at the time or not, but I think there was something that needed to come out."

The songs are mostly reflecting on coming of age, negotiating relationships, regret and learning hard life lessons. "There's definitely a few decisions in there that I'm reflecting on and trying to piece together the pieces of writing."

"I'm not great at writing happy songs. Even if we have something that sounds really happy, I have to go okay, how do I make this miserable (which is something I'm working on). I think some people are very good at coming up with characters and writing like that, but that's just not something I've ever been able to do. So, it is very much personal experiences I draw from and just how I'm feeling."

Much of Toby's writing is about complexity within conflict. He gets bored with the simple "I love you so much" or "I'm so sad you broke my heart". The interesting stuff happens in the middle. "They're dealing with either "I'm really enjoying this but I know it isn't right" or "I love you but I've got to let you go". He's looking at that territory of feeling happy and sad at the same time and then exploring that complexity.

"And yeah, the EP came out quite miserable. We're trying to work on that and build something a bit more positive going forwards."

Joe jumps on that, "That's a good way of selling it! Listen to our EP, it's pretty miserable." But the new releases coming up should be much more energetic. They're bringing in another year's worth of experience, a more groovy sound and some disco to get you on your feet and dancing. I'm sure that blues and soul sound will still be there holding it all together but I'm looking forward to hearing the next evolution of White Label.

Go and see the White Label headline show on 29 th November at The Butler for the release party for new single "Something About You" which gets released on the 21 st.










Profile: Andrew Merrit: Fading Echoes

One of our regular photographers, Andrew Merritt, recently had an exhibition at The Face Bar and in there, amongst his main photos of current performers, he showed this series of images which I just liked so I thought I'd share them with you in case, for some

unearthly reason, you didn't get there yourself. They focus on The Target – a venue which was closed well before I got to Reading but one which, I know, some still speak of with something verging on reverence.

Rather than second guess the point of it all, I'll leave it to Andrew to explain what we're looking at and the words of Andy Rowe giving it some Target-related context...















The images, donated and appropriated, are low resolution snaps, and are further degraded by conversion to monochrome and Photoshop adjustments, to further convey the passage of time and the fading of memory. The intention is to explore impermanence; of places, of social scenes, of memory, of physical and digital records.

The images concentrate on The Target, a lively music pub in Reading that hosted live bands most nights of the week from the 1970s until it closed in the mid-1980s. They are created by combining comparatively recent images of the venue, captured by anonymous urban explorers and shared on the internet, and photos from personal archives and shared on social media. — Andrew Merritt

"The Target was, the focus, the focal point of music in Reading, and it was the place to play. And there were a lot of regulars, yeah, a lot of regulars that were down there every night. I think we had bands every night, maybe apart from Mondays or something like that. I remember days when there was just the regulars down there, and a band would rock up from outside the area, didn't really bring anybody.

Of course there wasn't the social media then, there wasn't the ease of communicating that a show was on, so you really had to work hard at your mates. There were certain bands that built up a big following. Predatür is a good example. If the Preds were playing, then there'd be a full house. If Wildlife were playing, there'd be a full house.

You approached through the marketplace and then went down the stairs, which came down and then did a kink left with the stage to your left. So anybody that came down had to walk in front of the stage to go across the bar, so it was quite a moment. The funniest thing was if it had been raining, the stairs would be so slippery, and there would be more applause for somebody who went sliding down the stairs on their arse than for many of the bands that played there.

I remember it being, on a good night, a real proper sweaty rock venue. Getting into it, as a band, was always a challenge. You had to drive through security underneath the bus centre and then find your way through this maze of roads, find the right hole in the wall, which was the door into the Target, and then load in from there." — Andy Rowe

For an idea of what a night at The Target sounded like, there's a live album still available, recorded there by Twelfth Night in 1981. Just look it up.
